

Creator of Green Warrior Permaculture Launches New Initiative to Combat Climate Change

Green Warrior Permaculture, created by Steve Cran, is expanding the company's programs to include a Climate Change Adaptation Technology Specialty Course (CCATS). The CCATS course is the first permaculture training aimed at strengthening an area's ecosystem to withstand climate events. The company is expanding on its successful programs that provide relief for communities impacted by war, natural disasters, and poverty.

The newly announced service comes in reaction to increasing knowledge of the effects of climate change. The company hopes to curb the exponential rate at which climate change impacts the earth by introducing permaculture to communities before they are in dire need of relief.

“Permaculture” is a combination of “permanent” and “culture,” and the term was first coined in 1978 by Bill Mollison. Permaculture has many definitions and encompasses a variety of styles, but in essence is an agricultural system designed to have the diversity, stability, and resilience of natural ecosystems.

The CCATS course is a fourteen-day live-in course on Green Warrior Permaculture's eco-farms in Australia and the Philippines. Students will participate in hands-on lessons that will enable them to bring permaculture to their home communities.

Cran specifically develops his training programs to appeal to young adult learners. Cran states that he believes the current generation is overly steeped in internet culture and the best way to encourage real-life problem solving is for people to get their hands dirty. Training the younger generation will also impact the future of climate change relief efforts since it will lead to an increase in field technicians who can implement permaculture within new communities.

Cran has worked in the permaculture field for 27 years now and has introduced permaculture to communities such as the Australian outback, Timor Leste, Bali, Indonesia, and Ethiopia.

Cran explains: “The world's problems grow at an exponential rate, so I design projects that solve problems at an exponential rate.”

In addition to the CCATS course, Green Warrior Permaculture also provides training programs for future trainers, students interested in permaculture, permaculture aid specialists, and permaculture design.
